California local educational agencies face rising educator burnout, workforce shortages and student mental health needs that strain school climate and outcomes. Compliance systems create a paradox that contributes to turnover and stress. Grounded in Peter Senge's Compassionate Systems work through a partnership with the Center for Systems Awareness, this session highlights a replicable Ventura County model serving 19 districts and over 40 charter schools and regional agencies, integrating wellness and trauma-informed practices across four distinct teams to improve retention, strengthen climate and reduce turnover costs.
